Why?

'Drug abuse was identified as a growing health threat among male Travellers' –

All Ireland Traveller Health Study, 2010



Research aim

To explore Travellers' experiences of engaging in drug & alcohol support services across Ireland

Highlight what Travellers feel works for them – in their own words





What was confirmed?



- ✓ Lack of awareness of services available & how to use them
- ✓ Literacy difficulties are a barrier to engagement
- ✓ Word of mouth is main source of information
- ✓ Stigma and shame still impact on willingness to engage in support services

Traveller Women



- One third reported heroin as their first substance used
- Majority of cases, initiation to heroin was by husbands or partners
- Would not attend a service alone for the first time
- Have difficulties trusting new people

Key-working & care planning

- Almost all had a key worker
- 22 of the 30 felt key-working was the best approach for them
- Nearly two thirds did not know of the existence or function of their care plan
- Nearly half were uncomfortable asking for help
- 24 felt that development of pathways out of addiction were of benefit to them



Cultural influence on addiction




- Family can be a vital source of support
- •Nearly half said they felt shame for being a drug using member of the Traveller community
- •Just less than half were not currently in contact with their family
- •16 of 30 believed family support was essential to achieve a drug free lifestyle
- Almost half had attempted a home detox off heroin

Pavee Point implementation plan

- 1) Support establishment of Regional Peer Support Network (pilot underway)
- 2) Develop a drug worker support pack that organisations can use in induction and training (Feb 2012) includes tools to assist in engaging Travellers and their families
- 3) Provide Cultural Competency Training (2012)
- 4) Dissemination of already existing diversity posters
